Participation in Centre Gives!

Exciting news! Boal Estate Museum just became eligible for funding through the Centre Foundation's annual Centre Gives, a 36-hour, online giving event that begins this year May 11 at 9 am and ends May 12 at 9 pm. The foundation supports Centre County nonprofit organizations. By donating to the Boal Estate Museum through Centre Gives, your donation increases with a fund match—and possibly with extra prizes (see https://centregives.org/prizes)!

Why was the Boal Estate Museum formed? Nearly 70 years ago, when the Boal family created the Columbus Chapel & Boalsburg Estate Society (CCBES) as a private nonprofit entity, that was the accepted IRS designation for nonprofits. Today, however, that designation means an organization that redistributes donated funds to other nonprofits. (The Centre Foundation is such an organization.) Consequently, the CCBES has not been eligible for funding by most modern

charities. The newly-formed Boal Estate Museum (BEM) is a separate, *public* nonprofit under the umbrella of the CCBES—and therefore *is* eligible.

The BEM will focus its efforts on fundraising specific to its twofold mission:

» To stimulate interest in the living and constructive force of American tradition, as detailed by the artifacts and personal stories of the eight generations of Boals who lived at the Mansion and their extended families

from the

» To preserve, restore, maintain, and make available [those artifacts and stories] to persons interested in European and American history (Excerpted from the BEM lease.)

These funds are vital to the survival of the Museum, given our profound revenue losses resulting from COVID-19 restrictions. Donations at this time will enable ongoing revenue-generating projects to rapidly come to fruition. We are close to opening the second floor of the Boal Mansion as an entire separate tour, creating a large meeting space in the lower level of the Boal Barn, and adding climate control in the Barn for year-round theater, concerts, banquets, and lectures—among other projects.
