## Museum Tours and Upcoming Special Events

In spite of the continuing COVID-19 epidemic, this season the Boal Museum is open for tours by reservation plus a number of special events, listed below.

**Regular tours** include the ground floor of the Boal Mansion, the Columbus Chapel, and the Columbus Vault exhibit. These are offered 7 days a week, cost only \$10 for adults and \$6 for students under 17, and are free for Museum members, children 6 and under, and those active in the military. A tour takes 1-1/2 to 2 hours, depending on the number of questions visitors ask. Call Museum Director Bob Cameron (814-876-0129) to make your reservation in advance. Group tours are also available. (Status of the pandemic may further impact Museum operations.)




