Give the Gift of Membership!

October is Membership Month at the Boal Museum, when we promote membership in our Museum as a gift for friends and for yourself. The month began with the Olde Europe Festival on Sunday, October 8 (see pages 2–5), and will culminate with our Masquerade Ball on Friday, October 27 (page 2).

Additional activities during the month are helping to preserve and protect the remarkable collections here and—we hope—add members, too:

- » On October 5, the United Way Day of Caring, over 350 local volunteers spent the day at the Museum helping with wide-ranging projects, such as mulching our now almost-three miles of public trails, building a dance platform for the Olde Europe Festival, raking leaves all over the property, working on the front entrance to the new Columbus Exhibit, and cutting and moving unwanted brush and broken branches. Volunteers came from the Navy ROTC on Penn State's campus, the State College Area School District's Delta Program, St. Joseph's Academy Catholic School in Boalsburg, and the Central Pennsylvania Institute of Science and Technology. Docents, the NROTC, and many local restaurants provided lunch, and Museum docents gave "mini tours" to help these young people learn about the art and artifacts they were helping to preserve. - » Each year on Columbus Day, the Knights of Columbus celebrate Mass in the Columbus Chapel. While the Chapel holds very few people, those who have been coming for many years and newcomers are always welcome. Many are already Museum members. This year, we welcomed 31 visitors to the service and reception, a record participation!
- » During the Olde Europe Festival, Manuel Rosa gave a lecture about his 25 years of investigative research into the origins of Christopher Columbus. His book, <u>Columbus: The Untold Story</u>, is available in our Museum Gift Shop at a reduced price. Listeners were captivated by his new information!


